
PENNY IS A WHALE who used to sing beneath the sea. With her pod she'd hum their tunes and flip her tail with glee.

But then one day a storm did rage and Penny was afraid. She hid behind a shipwrecked boat and watched the ocean rage.


When the sun came out again, the sea was flat and calm. But Penny couldn't hear her friends, she knew something was wrong!
